A couple of Wednesday's ago one of the options for activity was to attend the study on Bishop Schnase book "Passionate Worship." The book is well thought through and gave us a lot to talk and pray about. Here are some of the highlights we talked about.

"Our experience of worship begins with the attitude, the spiritual eagerness and the passion we bring with us. In how we sing, pray, in how we greet others, in how we approach the sacraments, passionate worship begins with our love for God, our desire to open ourselves to God's grace and our eagerness for relationship with God."

God uses worship to transform lives, heal wounded souls, renew hope, shape decisions, provoke change, inspire compassion and bind people to one another. When we worship we form communities, shape souls, correct self-interest, bind people to each other and to God.

Through worship God pardons sins, restores relationships and changes lives. Worship also includes those practices done apart from the physical presence of others in the body of Christ such as personal devotions, private prayers, meditation and reading.

Some questions to ponder:

- When did you last feel that you could hardly wait for worship?
- How do you prepare your heart, soul and mind for worship?
- What sustains your devotional life through the week?
- Where do you most feel God's presence in worship?

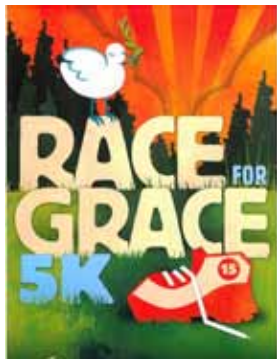
